**EUCEN's next conference, "Lifelong Learning for the New Decade", will be held in Rovaniemi (FI). The University of Lapland feels proud to be our host.**

In the new decade, universities will face challenges to develop learning including social and economic activities which are sustainable.

The newly emerging concept is 'restorative education'. It originally refers to the relation between people, nature and constructed environment, especially architecture. Restorative education uses an environmental-psychological approach to show how something has broken down or been disturbed either in the human or physical environment and how an equilibrium is restored by

introducing certain measures.

There are often many ways to apply restorative education to solving individual, social or communal problems and situations through learning. Examples can be found in the areas of restorative justice, creative economy, sustainable environmental technology, the production of touristic and cultural experiences, multiculturalism, renewing life situation that require the acquisition of new knowledge and skills.

The EUCEN 2010 organising committee welcomes proposals for workshops which present innovative and creative ideas and approaches in lifelong learning under the following themes:

- Lifelong learning, universities and socio-economic approaches,
- University and its role in facilitating innovations in lifelong learning at local, regional or international level,
- Lifelong learning and the environment.

The President of the EC, J M Barroso, announced on 27 November the list of new Commissioners for the period running to 31 October 2014.

The new Commissioners will have to gain approval from the European Parliament before they start their work.

This approval will take place on 11– 19 January 2010, in Brussels.

The Commissioner for the Directorate of Education and Culture is the Cypriot Androulla Vassiliou. On her mission's letter, she gives as priorities to (i) shape the right

framework for skills (ensuring that the education and training systems are fully in line with the current EU needs) and (ii) promoting cooperation between education, innovation and research policies.

## Thesaurus for education systems in Europe

The thesaurus for education systems in Europe (TESE) is a carefully selected list of key-words from the field of education (a so called multilingual controlled vocabulary) that serves as a reliable tool to retrieve information on education systems in Europe. It is designed by the Eurydice

Network as an indexing tool for all European providers of education information.

The 2009 edition of TESE is available on the Eurydice website in 15 language versions: Czech, Dutch, English, Estonian, Finnish, French, German, Greek, Italian, Lithuanian, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian,

Spanish and Turkish. The Latvian version is currently being prepared.

You can consult and download the thesaurus for free in three formats (xml, pdf and csv) and three displays (alphabetic, systematic and rotated). You can choose your preferred language version in the drop down menu in the
