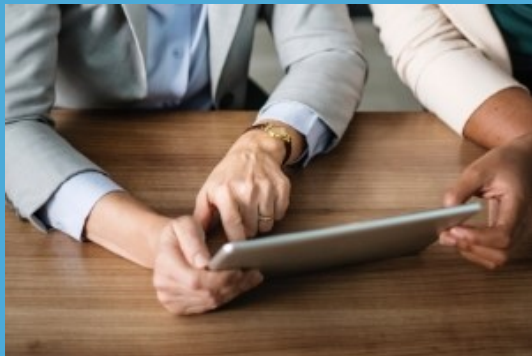
- **Online interactive self-assessment tool** enabling students to self identify their digital skills' profile & create a personalised digital skills learning pathway.

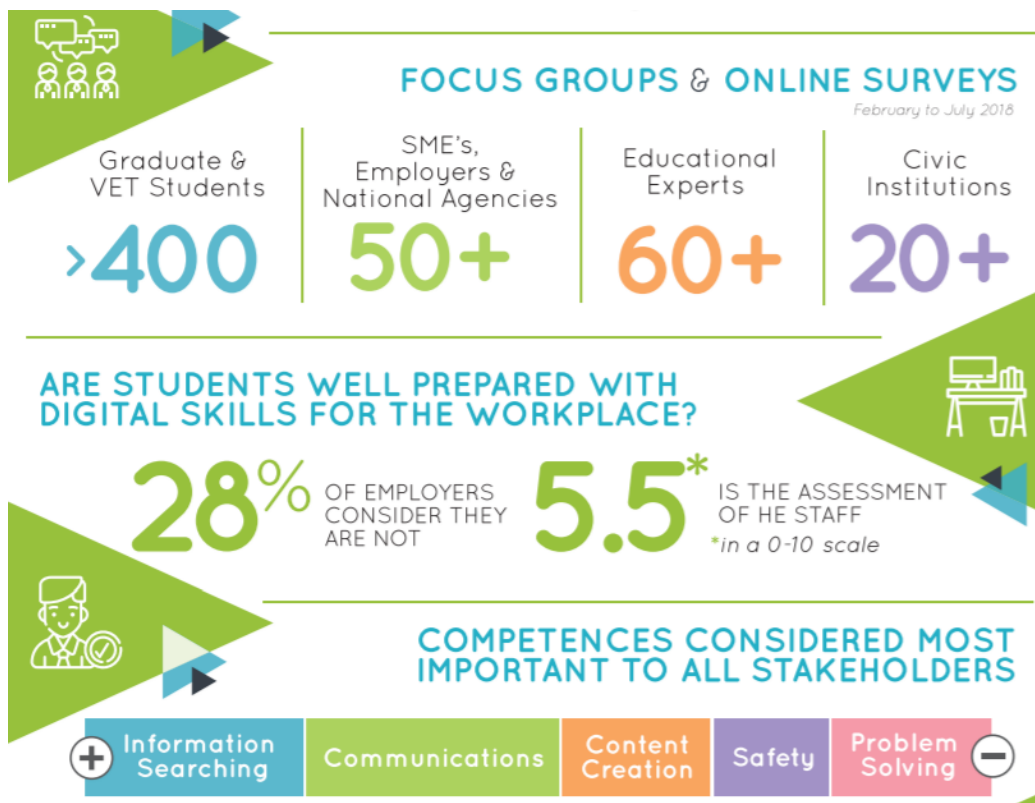
