## What is VINCE?

VINCE is an ERASMUS+ project that intends to develop training materials for university staff working in processes of Validation of Prior Learning (VPL) and Validation of Non-formal and Informal Learning (VNIL) with migrant and/or refugee students. The objective is to provide university staff with tools to be more prepared when working with newcomers who want to access Higher Education (HE) and want to be more aware and integrated in European society.

## Peer Learning Seminar

The full partnership of VINCE met in Barcelona for the first time from 26-27 March 2017.


The main objectives to achieve during this meeting were to get to know each other, work together and share the experiences and data collected in the preliminary phase of the project with colleagues.



In this first transnational encounter partners learnt a lot from each other and about the situation in relation to validation of prior learning and about refugees in Europe. Some key problems were highlighted at different points of the seminar by different partners and pointed out as crucial issues to understand the situation of newcomers: language barrier, traumatic and sad experiences, wish to return back home, long bureaucratic period that leads to boredom, missing sense of belonging, cultural diversity, lack of documentation. A full report was produced after the meeting.

The next meeting of VINCE has been programmed for 09-10 October and will be hosted by the Ludwig-Maximilians University Munich (DE).

With a participation of 15 people from 12 different institutions, the workshop presented both the project and its objectives as well as the draft guidelines that have been prepared, with the objective to collect feedback and opinions about the usability and appropriateness of these tools.

The presentation was well received and the open discussion offered the opportunity to participants to ask

The Swedish Council for Higher Education has organised the “Refugees’ impact on Bologna reform – Recognition of Prior Learning and inclusion in the light of increased migration” conference at Malmö University (SE).

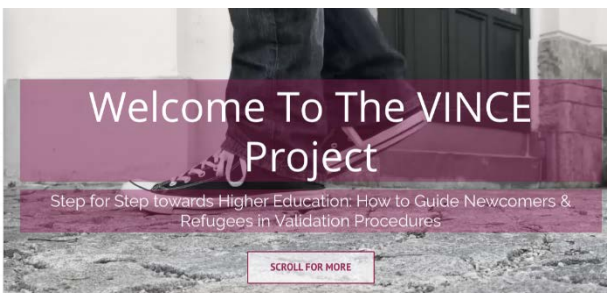

The conference, intended for practitioners, stakeholders and policymakers from EHEA countries, was attended by [eucen](#), in representation of VINCE. Arranged within the framework of the Bologna Working group 2 on Implementation, the event focused on RPL and opportunities for lifelong learning for newly arrived migrants and provided the opportunity for peer learning on procedures and methods for RPL. The participants were presented with examples of good practices within the EHEA on procedures and methods for RPL, with a special focus on inclusion and access to higher education for newly arrived migrants. The event aimed to inspire and encourage HEIs and stakeholders to develop their schemes for RPL and other initiatives.
